Principal:

Band Camp Last weekend we had a great weekend at Camp Kedron with 81 of our students attending the annual Band camp. We now have 3 Bands, and our conductors Ben and Surrey are to be commended on their commitment and enthusiasm in growing our Band program. Each spent the weekend tutoring and rehearsing. It was amazing to see the improvement by the final concert on the Sunday. A big thank you to Mrs Johnson and Ms Taylor for their organisation and staying overnight to assist with supervision. Thanks also to the parents who came and helped on the Saturday with the activities and transporting equipment to and from the site. A truly valuable experience for all students who attended.

Healthy Harold

This week the Healthy Harold Life Education van arrived at Manly Vale PS. All students attend the van for a 90-minute lesson. The lessons are interactive and fun. The van is here for 2 weeks and positioned next to the basketball court.

Opportunity Class (O.C) Placement test- Thursday 1 August

Year 4 students who have applied will sit the test on Thursday. The OC test consists of three sections:

- (1) Reading test (25 questions in 30 min)
- (2) Mathematical Reasoning test (35 questions in 40 min)
- (3) Thinking Skills test (30 questions in 30 min).

All three tests consist of only multiple-choice questions and there is no writing section in the OC test. Last year 99 000 students sat the test. This year there will be 13 300 students sitting the test.

Anxiety Project

This week all students will participate in Resilience building lessons in class. Every class will learn strategies to deal with anxiety and learn skills to build up their resilience. All teachers at Manly Vale Public school have been trained by a leading psychologist to deliver these lessons. The Anxiety Project will be delivered instead of our normal Child Protection lessons which have been now moved to Term 4.

Peer Support

This term will be the final term for Peer support. Our Year 6 students have been leading friendship and socialisation activities with multi-age groups all last term on a Monday afternoon at 2.30pm. Peer support lessons will finish on the last Monday of this term.

National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)- Closes Friday

The NCCD prompts schools to identify students with disability and to review their processes and practices. It records the adjustments already undertaken in schools to support students with disability to access and participate in education on the same basis as their peers. The data collection will close this Friday.
