State Athletics Carnival highlights

Congratulations to our wonderful students Jules Huisman, Isaac Han and Josie Han who represented our school as part of the Sydney North PSSA Stat Athletics Carnival last week. Each student showcased tremendous talent and determination, making us all very proud here at Manly Vale Public School. Isaacc achieved his personal best in the 800m event, finishing an impressive 13th in the state. Jules also recorded his personal best in the 200m event and placing 9th overall. A standout moment was Josi Han's incredible performance; she not only dominated the 800m and 1500m events but claimed first place in both races. Remarkably, Josi shattered the 1500m State record by an astonishing 8 seconds! Josie will now head off to Nationals on 28 November. We wish her all the best. Josie will receive a medal at the 3-6 assembly on Friday 8 November in front of her peers. Well done to all our talented athletes.
